riots of Summer 2024 that burst all over the country
250 after an alleged migrant murdered three young // girls, and
extremist Nigel Farage gained momentum by fanning the
flames. Furthermore, after riots abated, peaceful march took
place once again illustrating polarisation.

To top it off, both mainstream parties struggle -
which is understandable considering how Rishi Sunak is out
of touch in his Prada boots - to maintain their
300 edge against // the emergence of new parties be they
far-right parties or pro-European parties.

At the end of the day, I deem Stormer's secret
will to join back the European Union impossible because
Europe would reject him and he has better focusing on
inner issues.
