On Liberation Day, which took place on April 3rd, 2025, Donald Trump implemented tariffs on most countries, in order to "Make America Great Again". The goal was to prevent goods from coming into the US, in order to protect the country's industry. Nevertheless, these tariffs ^{have} come under fire as ^{have} they impacted consumers both in the US and the rest of the world. Therefore, have Donald Trump's tariffs been effective?

From a national viewpoint, Mr Trump's tariffs have been quite ineffective. Indeed, many countries retaliated with higher tariffs, which increased the price of every imported good for American people. This means ¹⁰⁰ that the price of everything increased, as the US does not produce most of what they sell. This also allowed companies that were not impacted by the tariffs to align their prices with the rest of the companies'. Moreover, the tariffs were overturned by the Supreme Court, meaning ¹⁵⁰ that implementing those steps was illegal. Therefore, the US will have to pay back all the profit that the country made with those taxes, which will be very costly.

On the world stage, D. Trump's tariffs ^{have} hurt the US's credibility. By implementing those tariffs, the US probably wanted to show ²⁰⁰ how powerful it still was. In fact, fear struck many countries, like France.

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However, every country retaliated with tariffs, and China even managed to get the US to back down. Indeed, although tariffs on Chinese goods reached more than 100%, China threatened to retaliate with restrictions on rare earths access. // 150
What is more, the US's unilateralism also hurt its allies with Canada and European countries. As a result, the US probably comes back weaker from those tariffs.

To sum up, although Donald Trump's tariffs were part of his plan to "Make America Great Again", it might have backfired, both on // the national and 300
